

# Peter Fee elected ACCA Scotland president



THE Scottish branch of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) has elected Peter Fee, pictured, as its new president.

Having commenced his career in banking, he qualified as a member of ACCA in 1996 and was awarded fellowship in 2001.

Since qualifying he has worked in a number of diverse industries and was also a part time lecturer in accounting.

Fee is currently finance director with Mackenzie Hall, a specialist outsourcing credit control and debt recovery

group. Speaking of his new role, Fee said: "I am thrilled to have been elected president of ACCA Scotland, which is a real honour.
